Provides volunteers with the supplies needed to teach American Heart Association certified CPR classes to more than 600 individuals throughout Houston each year. Junior League volunteer instructors teach basic life-saving skills to the general public through one of the only free CPR training programs in Houston. CPR involves mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and external compressions for the cardiac arrest victim. Adult, child and infant CPR is taught, as well as foreign body obstructed airway management. CPR has been a Junior League project for 34 years.

THE WORLD IS NOT ENOUGH ♦ \$15,000

Enables the Junior League volunteers in the VIEW (Volunteers In Evening Workshop) project to touch the lives of thousands in the Houston community by creating and sewing more than 10,000 useful items including school supply packages, finger puppets, craft activities, blankets, diaper bag sets and various newborn clothing items. These items are distributed by Junior League volunteers at many of the League’s 34 community projects, including BEAR...BE A Resource for CPS Kids, Casa de Esperanza de los Niños, DePelchin Children’s Center, Dress For Success Houston, Houston Area Women’s Center, Houston’s Ronald McDonald House, Kids’ Meals, Memorial Hermann – Texas Medical Center, Pen Pals, Picture Pals, Sing Along with Seniors, Star of Hope, SuperKids Pediatric Mobile Clinic, Teen Health Clinic – Baylor College of Medicine, Texas Children’s Hospital and The University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center. VIEW has been a Junior League project for 32 years.

MOONRAKER ♦ \$10,000

Provides healthy meals, prepared by the Junior League Tea Room, and snacks to approximately 720 students participating in the Children’s Museum of Houston Overnight Adventures Program. While spending the night at the museum, Junior League volunteers act as role models for young girls by participating in craft projects, exploring museum exhibits, and focusing on nutrition and health. Children’s Museum of Houston has been a Junior League project for 21 years.

FOR YOUR EYES ONLY ♦ \$5,000

Supports Junior League volunteers as they participate as camp counselors in a weeklong summer day camp at Camp Rainbow for children with diabetes and their siblings. Volunteers provide, plan, and facilitate recreational activities by acting as art and crafts coordinators and camp counselors, enabling children to thrive in a fun, supportive and safe camp environment. Camp Rainbow has been a Junior League project for 21 years.
